Safe Pets

Safe Pets is a unique program offered by CVHS for residents of Strafford County. As an alternative to surrendering a pet, Safe Pets provides a temporary safety net for pets when their owners find themselves in a time of transition. Victims of domestic violence, those who must be hospitalized for an extended time, and even service people being sent overseas can call on CVHS to provide temporary care. Safe Pets are housed both in shelter and/or placed in foster care.

Mother Spay Program - Pope Memorial CVHS in Dover:

If your female dog or cat is expecting or just had babies, we can help through our Mother Spay Program. Once the litter is weaned, we will spay the mother at no cost to you and find homes for all the little ones if you admit them to our Adoption Program. Mom will stay with you, her spay surgery taken care of!

By spaying mom, you ensure no more unwanted litters and you improve your pet's quality of life and health.

By surrendering the kittens or puppies to PMHS for adoption, you remove the stress of trying to find home for them yourself. Like all pets in our Adoption Program, they will be spayed/neutered, receive veterinary care, vaccinations and preventatives.

ALL of this is at no cost to you.

The mother's spay surgery fee is waived ONLY if you surrender the kittens/puppies to PMHS for adoption.

NH Animal Population Control Program - Plan B (Concord, NH)

Eligibility Requirements: To be eligible to participate in this program you must be on one of the seven programs: Food Stamps, Medicaid or Healthy Kids Gold, TANIF, The Old Age Assistance Program, Supplemental Security Income Program, Aid to the Needy Blind Program, APTD Program. A person may also be qualified if they meet the income guidelines for the program. Fees: \$25 per animal which includes spay or neuter and \$15 towards a rabies vaccination.

Procedure: Obtain an application by calling the Animal Population Control Program at 603-271-3697.

NH Spaying and Altering Service Program-Concord, NH

Eligibility Requirements: To be eligible to participate in this program you must be a NH resident who needs financial assistance. Fees: Dogs are \$70 for females and \$50 for males. Cats are \$50 for females and \$35 for males. Procedure: Obtain an application by calling (603) 224-1361 (before 2:00pm) or writing to: NHAS, 8 Hutchins Street, Concord, NH 03301. Mail in the application with appropriate fee and you will be sent a certificate and list of participating veterinarians.

Rozzie May Animal Alliance-Conway, NH

Fees: Female cats \$75 and Male cats \$60. Dogs \$80 and up depending on sex and weight

Procedure: Call 603-447-1373 or visit www.rozziemay.org. Vaccines also available and has mobile unit that travels to Rochester, Dover and Brentwood April – November.

New Hampshire SPCA - Stratham Website: nhspca.org/low-cost-spay-neuter-clinics

- Clinics are held an average of two times per month, usually on Tuesdays.
- Space on all clinic days is first come, first served. Clinics are popular and typically fill six to eight weeks in advance.
- Registration in advance is required and is done over the phone or in person by coming into the shelter.
- Payment for the surgery fee is due at the time of registration and is payable by credit card or cash only. ***Please call to discuss costs for services.***
- Due to the popularity of the Spay and Neuter Clinics, space on clinic dates cannot be held without payment.
- Once registered, you will receive a confirmation email with important information and forms. Please review this information prior to the clinic date. Consent and vaccine forms will need to be signed by the pet owner.

In addition to the spay/neuter surgery, the following services are available for an additional fee (all prices are per pet):

Microchip: \$25

Topical Flea/Tick treatment: \$10

E-Collar cone (for after surgery): \$10

Rabies vaccination: \$20*

Distemper vaccination: \$20

Please note these additional services are only offered to animals registered for the spay/neuter clinic.

603-889-2275 ext 21, www.hsfh.org. Low cost vaccination clinics and low cost spay/neuter clinics. Female and male cats \$85 includes rabies, distemper, microchip and revolution. Male dogs -\$150. They do not do female dogs.

Friends of Animals Program-National Program.

Eligibility Requirements: To be eligible to participate in this program you must be a cat or dog owner regardless of financial need. Fees: Dogs are \$110 for females and \$74 for males. Cats are \$85 for females and \$61 for males. Procedure: Obtain an application by calling 1-800-321-7387 or www.friendsofanimals.org.

Write to: Friends of Animals, PO Box 30054, Hartford, CT 06150 Mail in the application with appropriate fee and you will be sent a certificate and list of participating veterinarians. Then call and make an appointment with a participating veterinarian. Additional charges may apply depending on individual vet that you choose.

Merrimack River Feline Rescue Society – Catmobile

Locations are subject to change (mobile unit) Fees: Female cats \$120, Male cats \$80 (includes Spay/neuter, rabies vaccine, flea treatment, deworming and exam. Microchip available for \$20). Qualified feral cats are \$35.

New Hampshire Humane Society-Laconia, NH Spay Neuter Assistance Program (SNAP)

Eligibility Requirements: SNAP is designed to help those individuals who can not afford spay/neuter surgery and who do not qualify for other spay/neuter assistance programs.

Fees: \$125 for female cats, \$85 for male cats, \$155 for male dogs. Rabies vaccines are \$12, Distemper vaccine are \$12. Other fees can apply (hernia repair, in heat, deworming, etc) Procedure: Please visit www.nhhumane.org/snap.php to fill out an online application and to see current fee schedule and dates for surgery.

Animal Allies-Manchester, NH

Open to any cat owner that needs financial assistance getting their cat spayed/neutered. Females are \$85 and males are \$50. For more info, call 1-800-990-7729. No checks accepted. www.animalallies.org.

Salem Animal Rescue League –Salem, NH

Female cats: \$50 and Male cats: \$25

Must meet national poverty guidelines. Includes nail trim, distemper and rabies.
